This Urgent and Emergency Care focussed pathway would necessitate Trainee Nursing Associates (TNAs) to undertake work-based placements which will involve rotations in primary, secondary and social care across West Yorkshire. We are therefore looking for an enthusiastic clinical educator with an interest in the urgent and emergency care field to support this group of learners across their unique programme of learning.

Applications are invited from experienced registered nurses/nursing associates who wish to further develop their teaching and scholarship abilities. The primary purpose of the role will be to contribute to the development & implementation of the UEC TNA programme and to support the delivery of clinical teaching and assessment. We would welcome applications from registered nurses with a background and experience in Urgent and/or Emergency care secondary or primary care settings. This is an exciting opportunity for a person who is keen to contribute to the development and implementation of nursing education and the future UEC nursing workforce.

You will work flexibly with the academic teams at the University of Huddersfield and clinical teams supporting practice learning. You will support UEC TNAs in both theory and practice settings and we will support you with your personal development.

The post is for 2 years initially. Successful candidates will be seconded from their employing organisation. **Support from your seconding manager is essential.**
